

MESSAGE FROM CLUB PRESIDENT


A warm welcome to members, associated members, supporters and sponsors to the Brunswick Surf Life Saving Club 60th Anniversary.


I have been president for the past two years, and I have never known an organisation to be so deeply involved with tradition and support in and out of surf life saving duties as are the members of this club.

After checking all available records from when the first rescue was recorded by the club, 10th January, 1936, to the end of 1993-94, the following figures emerged. Total Bronze Medallions gained 822. Total of other Surf Life Saving Awards gained 426. Rescues reel line and belt 91. With I.R.B. 49. With other equipment/or without 103. Preventative actions 1016. First Aid including stings 1747. Awards gained does not include the Junior Activities Group "Nippers". Figures for 1994 - 1995 were not available when compiling this book in February 1995.

INTRODUCTION BY THE AUTHOR,








1994-95 M.J. "Mark" Quinn






The cake was cut by 3 surviving members of the first Bronze Squad of our club, Harry and Clive Wraight and Max Pearse. Other pre-war members attending were introduced to the gathering, Jim Mortimor, Stan Clark, Joe Comon, Clive Mallam, Cec Healy, Frank Healy, Duncan Schweitzer, Alf Schweitzer, Gordon Wraight, Col Torrens, Austen Lebern, Neville Stubbings, Charlie Raisin and Wally Gaggin. Mr. Jim Flanagan, Life Member of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia presented the Association "50 Year Award" for services given to our club and surf life saving in general to Harry and Clive Wraight.

Healy Family Ted - Cec - Frank - Stan.


Also a lot of 3 and 2 brothers came from the same family, and sons, daughters and grandchildren of many of these people have been active members of this great club. A copy of the Jubilee Book " 50 Years of Service " was issued to all members who attended the dinner. Copies requested by Sydney University, La Trobe University, Sydney Library Services, Mitchell Library, Lismore and Mullumbimby Museums, Canberra Library, and private collectors of Surf Life Saving History, and club supporters.

Facts compiled from available records show that in the first 50 years members rescued 91 people with line, reel and belt -50 with other gear - 154 without gear - 6 needed resuscitation - 125 needed treated in First Aid Room. A reminder that there are still copies of the " 50 Year Book " available from the club or myself at a cost of \$5.

1985 - 86

Further points of interest from the 85 - 86 period. Far North Coast Branch in an effort to try and get club members to gain more S.L.S.A. of A. Awards, instigated an incentive scheme for all of its clubs. As a result Brunswick was awarded 2nd place in this competition and also for the 3rd time since the competition was inaugurated, Brunswick came 1st in the Far North Coast Branch Patrol Efficiency Competition. An A.M.B.U. simulator mannequin was the prize. Brunswick was also presented with a 2 way radio for winning the 1.R.B. Championships. Our March Past Team of all female members, who were coached by Les Wraight, came

2nd in the in a point score for this event held at all carnivals during the season and also they also won a 2 way radio for the club. Our LR.B. crews came 1st in the Far North Coast Championships, 4th at the inaugural N.S.W. Country Championships, 2nd in N.S.W. State Championships, (1st in A & B Assembly and 3rd in A Rescue). Trish Armstrong competed with the Australian Junior Kyak Team at Belgrade in Yugoslavia, where she reached the finals.

Great club supporters, Elaine and Pat Quinn of Ampol Mullumbimby, sponsored the Annual Surf Carnival at Brunswick-club entered a March Past Team and several floats in the January 1986 Festival of Fish'N'Chips procession. Brunswick Valley Malibu Club donated a flexible fuel tank for use in the I.R.B.'s-more and more female members joining the club in an active capacity "great". Mullumbimby Day Care, a senior citizens group, donated a motor mower to the club, and Dick and Billy Arthur of the Corner Pharmacy donated a fibreglass stretcher for use in spinal injuries.

The job of permanent lifesaver at Brunswick over the Christmas New Year period was shared Raymond Musgrave and Mark Edwards with three weeks each. Junior Club Person of the Year Joanne Quinn. Senior Club Person Keith Batson.



1986 - 1987

The club contacted I.R.B. manufacturer Achillies of Japan, suggesting changes in hull design to suit Australian surf life saving conditions. Achillies replied offering full co-operation.

1.R.B. COMPETITION

1st in Branch Championships and 5th in State Championships. Mallams of Mullumbimby donated a new Mercury motor for use in I.R.B. competitions - Eric Thompson of the Ocean Shores Park O'Tel donated a large tent top with poles and pegs for use as a shelter on the beach during surf carnivals - at this stage I would also like to record that Dick and Billie Arthur, Corner Pharmacy Mullumbimby, and Russell and Jackie Dennet of Foodtown Mullumbimby, later combined to donate canvas sides to fit this top, making it a most useful piece of equipment for the club. Some pupils at the Ashford Public School, near Inverell, had a holiday at our clubhouse under leadership of one of our active members, Meg Musgrave who was teaching at that school. Altogether the school had three holidays at Brunswick under Meg's leadership although on the last trip she changed her name to Quinn after her marriage to Mark. It was nice to hear that our club members also supported Meg by entertaining the children. The club also benefited from these trips as the school made nice donations in appreciation. Brunswick came 3rd in the Patrol Efficiency Competition in the Far North Coast Branch. Chris Johnston awarded Life Membership of the club. A 250 Club organised by Bruce Garrard and supported by many Brunswick Heads business houses and the Brunswick Heads Bowling Club resulted in a nett profit of \$2.600. Cadet Club Person of the Year Andrew Arthur. Junior Club Person of the Year Kim Kent. Club Person of the Year Jim Smith.

CLUB CARNIVAL COMPETITION


Branch Championships-Lyn Cuthbertson 3rd in Female Surf Race-6th in Novice Surf Race-2nd in Female Flags. Club 1st in Junior R & R - 1st Junior Relay -2nd Senior Relay. Todd Cole 1st Junior Flags, also 2nd Junior Flags at N.S.W. Country Championships.

The Sonics, a well known local group who included one of our members, Doug Liebke, conducted a special night at the Mullumbimby Ex Servicemens Club, proceeds equally shared by the Brunswick Valley Rescue Squad - Surf Club and the Mullumbimby High School Band, \$248 to each group. Bobby Le Brun, well known comedian who appeared in surf club function fund raising concerts in earlier years, died aged seventy six. Mullumbimby Rotary Club offered to build an Observation and Communication Tower, and donated \$4,200 towards the cost, they also engaged well known local builder Bill Ball to supervise the project which included some voluntary work.

1987 - 1988

Leonne and Ed Meskell took over the licence of the Commercial Hotel, Mullumbimby and have been generous supporters of this club till the time of writing this book in 1995. They allow a raffle team led by Barry Hammond and Dick Arthur and other volunteers to conduct a raffle each Friday afternoon which raises approximately \$5,000 per year for our club. 1995 New Team headed by Stan Ceglinski and Bob Black.

Nippers purchased a big tent for shelter of their members at carnivals and fund raising activities. By adding the name of various sponsors to the tent top, the overall cost was greatly reduced.



January 1988 the new Rotary Observation and Communication Tower was officially opened and handed over by Harry Wraight, a foundation member of both clubs. July 1987, Mallams of Mullumbimby changed ownership, but is still known as Mallams. The new owners, Gareth and Scott Evans, continued as great supporters of our club until they in turn sold out to John and Guy Mallam, grandsons of the founders of that firm. John and Guy are very generous supporters of the club, both from Foodland and also from Mullumbimby & Brunswick Cellars to this date 1995. Brunswick Surf Life Saving Club became an Incorporated Body on July 8th, 1987. Donation received from Tweed Heads Bowling Club of \$200. N.S.W. State Centre of the S.L.S.A. of A., directed that all Surf Life Saving Clubs and Junior and Nippers Clubs become amalgamated. This has proven to be most successful at Brunswick Heads. Fund Raising Golf Day at Mullumbimby, sponsored by John and Pam Fenn of Brunswick Financial Service and Neil and Vivian McDonald, netted \$700 for the club. Raymond Musgrave and Gary Spears of Byron Bay shared the six

week as permanent life savers at Brunswick. Deaths of former members and great supporters of the club, Clive Mallam, Jim Richardson, Jim Mortimor and Mary Cowling. Marriages of Mark and Meg Quinn - Bruce and Judy Garrard -Kim and Neil Hensen.

Lyn Cuthbertson 3rd place in Australian Age Swimming Championships. Byron Shire and State Government combined to undertake beach foreshore and dune restoration by planting -fencing and erecting walkways, this has proved to be most successful as at 1995. Gordon Wraight and Les Elfield, both early active members of this club, planted coconut palms to assist in beautifying the area. All these trees were stolen within a week of planting. Patricia Armstrong joined the Police Force and was stationed at Broken Hill during her first year. The S.L.S.A. reminded all members that the association insurance cover does not cover members for medical, dental or optical services and no ambulance services, it is hoped that all members arrange their own benefit, present day members should also check this cover.

AUSTRALIAN I.R.B. CHAMPIONSHIPS (1st time held).

At Cronulla only 5 A Grade events held. Brunswick was the only club to qualify in all finals in rough seas on the Saturday. On Sunday in calmer seas Brunswick won four of the five events and was second in the other event but was disqualified for leaving motor in gear. A wonderful effort! Brunswick was given the honour of leading all club teams in a March Past held on the Sunday morning. The latest amended model Achillies hull arrived ten days before this carnival - Mercury motors supplied and tuned by Gryff Ethell of Lismore Outboard and Marine fuel supplied by P & E Quinn Ampol Mullumbimby - transport to the carnival by Rob Jarvis of Brunswick Valley Coaches. I.R.B. competitors for the season were Mark Quinn, Keith Batson, Mark Edwards, Neil Hansen, Andrew Arthur, Raymond Musgrave, Joanne Quinn, Lyn Cuthbertson plus cooks, gear handlers etc. A great season. The Far North Coast Branch Championships Surf Carnival was held at Fingal.



BRANCH CHAMPIONSHIPS 1987 - 1988

L.R.B. Far North Coast Championship Carnival was held at Cabarita Beach. After coming 1st in the previous seven years of branch championships, Brunswick club came second to Ballina and picked up \$400 as a prize from the sponsor "The Egg & 1".


ZONE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Mayne Nickless Knock Out at Sawtell - Brunswick 1st, Ballina 2nd. Mayne Nickless 2nd round at Pt. Macquarie - Ballina 1st, Brunswick 2nd. Ballina won on a count back and represented zone in finals in Sydney where they came 1st.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

August 1987 at Hawks Nest - Soldiers Beach 1st - Ballina 2nd -Brunswick 3rd from the 28 clubs competing.

Results - Brunswick 1st March Past, 1st Open Beach Relay, Our Ladies March Past Team, coached by Les Wraight, came 2nd in the overall point score at carnivals and won a Rescue Tube donated by Radio 2LM as a prize. June 1987 first club newsletter published to advise club members and supporters of Fiesta activities. Alan and Irene Mortlock retired from the Ambulance Service after being station officers at Mullumbimby for many years, during which time they have been a tower of strength to the surf club as well as other community organisations, thanks Mort and Irene. Jim Flanagan, past President of the Far North Coast Branch wrote the 50 year history of the branch called "The Bronze Norcoasters ". January 1988 our club took a major part in the festival of the Fish'N'Chips procession with a number of floats - a March Past Team and flag colour party. Club Secretary, Keith Batson, suggested that the committee should investigate increased litigation over Public Liability, a disease of the times creeping into Australia from the U.S.A. where people sue other persons on any excuse. National Council of S.L.S.A. of A. sent out circulars to all clubs suggesting that they fully insure themselves against such happenings as patrolled areas not fully supervised, safe access to clubhouse areas could leave clubs open:

Keith, assisted by the Club Executive, compiled several circular letters which were sent to all Surf Life Saving Clubs in N.S.W. and southern Old - Branches - State Centres etc. as well as 63 local volunteer groups whose members could face public liability problems, asking them in turn to contact their State and Federal Politicians to bring in laws to curtail such large scale litigation and awards paid to claimants by the court. A lot of favourable feed back from clubs as well as politicians, and it was also mentioned in State and Federal Parliament. Final outcome - not much gain, but as Keith said "we have the satisfaction of being able to say we told you so".

1988 - 1989

I.R.B. Competition

Far North Coast Branch Championship - Brunswick 1st.

Zone Championships - Brunswick and Ballina equal tie 1st.

<u>State Championships</u> - there were two State Championships this year, the first at Black Head - Brunswick came 2nd, Ballina 1st. The second was held at Avalon at the end of the season Brunswick 1st and Ballina 2nd.

<u>National Championships</u> - Monavale 1st, Brunswick and Alexander Headland tied for 2nd/3rd place.

Expo Display

The six top I.R.B. crews in N.S.W. were asked to compete in the N.S.W. Government Day in Brisbane. Our members, all dressed in uniform, won favourable comment from the public when they took part in the

Expo Day Parade then competed in four events, winning two of them. Strong tidal conditions made it very difficult for all competitors. As a result the club won \$400 in prize money and was allowed \$216 expenses.

Brunswick again emerges the top L.R.B. Club in Australia on a basis of gold medals won at all carnivals during the season,

Major sponsors - Brunswick Heads Bowling Club (I.R.B. Hull) -Mallam Cellars - P & E Quinn Ampol and Gryff Ethell Mercury Motors. Only nine crew members competed for the season, Mark Quinn, Raymond Musgrave, Keith Batson, Andrew Arthur, Lyn Cuthbertson, Rebecca Philips, Justin Prisk, Chris Johnston - another great year. The Clubhouse was given a face lift by painting and general maintenance by Byron Shire Council. World Master Swim Championships held in Brisbane, Lyn Cuthbertson competed in six events and was placed in each one of them. Sue Batson was 9th in the Australian Team. Sad to record the passing of Hec Gaggin -Jed Brown and Laurie Maria. Mark Quinn again sponsor of shirts for patrol use, N.S.W. State Centre arranged Hepatitis B vaccinations for life savers and club supporters. Vaccine was made available at cost by the manufacturers and Drs. Coker and Holmes gave their services to the club to complete the three needle course. A total of 113 person were treated. N.B. A reminder -booster needle due 94-95 period. Contract life saving introduced by State Centre. Councils patrolling beaches in this area arrange with the Far North Coast Branch to supply permanent life savers when surf club patrols are off duty, by doing this Council are relieved of the responsibility of finding fully qualified persons to do the job and in addition, State Centre give a grant to clubs to cover wear of equipment used by these people on holiday periods. Two people drowned after entering surf at dusk, one body recovered that night and one next day. It is thought that alcohol may have been involved. Income for season -Leonne Greentree donated a Kitchen Whizz as a raffle prize which raised \$530. B.B.Q. at Woodchops netted \$900. Harold Winkel. one of the axemen, donated his prize of \$110 to the surf club.

A Ferguson tractor was purchased (to replace the now defunct beach buggy) at a cost of \$2000, a \$1000 of which was donated by Trevor and Liz Watts and Martin Jansen of Byron Bay Motor Wreckers - \$500 from Nippers Club and \$500 from Senior Club. The tractor is called "Dutchy" to commemorate the memory of Jerry Jansen, a supporter of this club. Seven club members presented with S.L.S.A. of A. " 25 Year Service "badges, these seven men gave 96 years of active membership and 150 years as active supporters, they were Gordon Wraight, Dave Moss, Bill Ball, Bruce Stewart, Bob Batson, Bill James and Phil Batson.

Under 18 Beach Relay - Brunswick 3rd - Nina Fitzgerald, Lee Evans, Shane Arthur, Andrew Arthur were members of the beach relay team. Brunswick was 3rd in the March Past Event. Adrian and Jenny Russell a son - Gryff and Kay Ethell a daughter. Nippers Annual Report stated that Petria Thomas -Min Lewis - Adrian Stevens - Stephen Johnson - Chris Still -Matt Hopf - Cecil Mudge - were all going up to the Senior Club. 
As a novel means of fundraising, Stan and Noelene Ceglinski, donated scrap firewood from the Shingle Mill, to be sold by Club Members, under leadership of Roslyn Hogan. Dave Moss was presented with Surf Life Saving Association "50 Year Award" for services given to this club and the association, congratulations Dave.



1993 - 1994

The team was Sam Fuller, Richard Kratzman, Phil Parker, Scott Hogan, David Parker, Lee Evans, Mark Quinn, Sarah O'Connor, and Peter Ceglinski - the youngest team ever. They travelled to Sydney to compete in the State Finals but were unplaced. The prize money for the branch win, \$1425, paid for the team to go to Sydney.

Two new wavemaster boards purchased for training purposes at \$600 each. Help Appeal at Brunswick Heads on Boxing Day raised \$1424. Nil appeal at Mullumbimby this season. John McKeag of Brunswick Heads made and erected Club Honour Boards at a cost of \$1864. January 1994, Noel McGregor was awarded the Order of Australia Medal on Australia Days Honours List, for his services to the Showmans Guild of Australia, and to Regional Festivals in Queensland and Northern N.S.W. A great supporter of our club, thanks and congratulations Noel.

Brunswich Heads Bowling Club donated \$800 to purchase a Rescue Board for club. Mark Quinn donated \$375 for Patrol Shirts. Northern Rivers Electricity Refund \$415.

1994 - 1995

Annual Gear Report was sent to Branch shows that the club has 3 reels, lines and belts, 8 rescue tubes, 1 surf boat, 3 rescue boards, 2 x l.R.B.'s, 3 x 25 h.p. outboard motors, 9 x 2 way radios for use on beach, l.R.B.'s, branch radio link and Patrol to Aircraft contact. The club has fourteen active l.R.B. drivers on Patrol Roster and three trainee drivers logged 946 hours for the season.

Mallams of Mullumbimby have agreed to be major sponsors of the club I.R.B. for three years. This firm have been generous supporters of our club since it was formed in 1935, and it is pleasing to see the third generation of the family conduct the store, as well as the Mullumbimby and Brunswick Cellars, still active on our behalf. At a meeting held on 3rd July, 1994, a date was set and preliminary details discussed re 60th Anniversary 1995. Tony Carsburg Holden again supported the club with a donation of \$500 - also Pat and Elaine Quinn of Ampol Mullumbimby with a similar amount. A novel means of fund raising for the club was a "Mock Wedding" with males and females, including guests, cross dressing. A wonderful function and a good fund raiser for the club. A couple of weeks later a video of the function was shown at the clubhouse. Congratulations to the few members who actually did the work of catering and organising both functions.

Early 1995 saw some changes in Club Officials, with Club Captain Lee Evans resigning on transfer away, Andrew Arthur to take his place. Secretary Tony Parker and Treasurer Bob Kilpatrick both resigned and Meg Quinn elected as Secretary and Raymond Musgrave as Treasurer for the remainder of the season.

It was also decided to instruct Surf Life Saving Australia to award "25 Year Service" badges to Keith Batson and Adrian Russell, and the "50 Year Service" badges to Reg Byrnes and John Graham. All awards will be presented during our "60th Anniversary Celebrations".

The N.S.W. Government Dept. of Sports and Recreation, through Mr. Don Page M.P., has donated \$2,000 towards the cost of a new I.R.B. Hull. A much appreciated donation, thanks Don.

The permanent contract lifesavers for the holiday period were John Styles. Phil Parker and Peter Miller.

Sad to record the passing of Dave Watt and Kon Siwicki, both supporters of our club since coming to the area.

CHINCOGAN FIESTAS

1987

Surf Club Secretary Keith Batson inspired the club to enter a Queen Candidate in the 1987 Chincogan Fiesta, and to apply to the Fiesta Committee as a beneficiary from funds raised. The finance was needed to improve facilities at the club house for our female members.

A Fund Raising Committee with Mrs. Jenny Batson as Chairperson, Keith Batson as Secretary and Reg Byrnes as Treasurer, Mrs. Maureen Ball, Mrs. Flo Watson and Mr. George Clothier all became very involved in fund raising (they were known as the gang of four with Jenny as leader), and this group continued on for the 1988 - 1989 Fiestas. Our club was given minor beneficiary status and one of our very active and fully qualified lifesavers, Miss Leigh Emery of Mooball was chosen as our entrant in both the Personality and Charity Queen sections. Fund raising included street stalls, pie drives, lamington sales, raffles, Fun Day at club, sewing, Bride Doll competition, Junior Disco and support from schools.

Leigh was crowned Personality Queen at the Fiesta Ball, and a result of our major fundraising was also crowned Miss Charity Queen (a first ever double at the Fiesta!). It was of interest to note that other fully qualified lifesavers from our club represented Rotary (Patricia Armstrong), and Anthea Cowley was the Rescue Squad Queen.

1988

Following the success of 1987 Fiesta, the same committee agreed to continue fund raising and were again chosen as minor beneficiaries of the 1988 Fiesta. Another fully qualified member of our club, Miss Melinda Emery (sister of Leigh) was chosen as our Queen candidate - all previous methods of fund raising were conducted, a novelty horseracing and screw night, fashion parade, tennis day, golf day, car wash and vintage train ride, Masonic Lodge bowls day, B.B.Q's, adult refreshment competition, raffles of a painting donated by Reg Gregor. The surf club raised \$10,616, coming second to Rotary, the winners with \$11,020, another pleasing result.



1989

Once again an all out effort was made for our club to become major beneficiaries of the 1989 Fiesta. A well prepared written application and a personal appearance before the Fiesta Committee saw our club chosen as a major beneficiary. Miss Allison Watson, daughter of the long time supporters Flo and Ted Watson was chosen as our entrant in the Queen competition. The same Committee used similar methods of fund raising, plus a pig donated by Terry and Dot Johnston was cut up for Pork Tray Raffle prize - floor show night at Mullumbimby Bowls Club,

fund raising and a Mardi Gras Street Carnival night, progressive dinner calling at Flo and Ted Watson's residence, then by buses to Grace and Mario Solinas residence at The Pocket where an Italian evening was held (raised \$800), and the Masonic Lodge raised \$1300 from various activities held on our behalf.



This wonderful all out effort by club members, supporters, and the public in general resulted in an all time record of \$17,564 being raised and handed to the committee and as a result Allison was crowned Charity Queen for the 1989 Chincogan Fiesta. I must make special mention to the support given by school children, and to Mr. Steve Brown who made his hot bread shop available to the committee over the three years for lamington making and pie drives. I got carried away and made 200 bottles of jam and pickles for sale at street stall, amazing!, they all sold. A break down of fundraising during the three years:

Also \$7,383 raised by us in the first two years was distributed to other community service groups by the Fiesta Committee. Many thousands of lamington and do-nuts were made and over 100,000 raffle tickets sold by our volunteers.

1994 CHINCOGAN FIESTA

The club was again minor beneficiary and was represented by Kelly Batson, one of our fully qualified lifesavers. Kelly was crowned as personality Queen, but unfortunately due to the lack of support from members, fundraising was limited -only \$2,830 was raised and the club was given \$4,504 as minor beneficiary to purchase a new I.R.B. Following the 1988 Fiesta, Stereo Radio 2LM and the Australian Guarantee Corporation Ltd., combined to introduce a "Monthly Service



Award" throughout the Northern Rivers, with Father Peter Karam as Coordinator, with a monthly prize of \$500. A submission was prepared outlining the efforts of our fundr-aising committee, and the needs of the club to improve facilities for female members and general activities of our club. As a result we won the inaugural monthly award, and I was very proud to be presented with the cheque and plaque on behalf of the club, it is of interest to note that the second award was won by Brunswick Heads Progress Association.

1982

When going through old records I found that the Mullumbimby Football Club and the Surf Club combined to sponsor a Queen candidate in the Chincogan Fiesta; although not winning, both clubs benefited by \$1260 each. Miss Susan Bower was our Queen

HISTORY OF CLUBHOUSES

When the club was formed in 1935, the first clubhouse was a few hessian bags wrapped around trees as a members changeroom -an old shed was donated to the club and members dismantled and transported the materials across the river by row boat, where it was re-erected as a changeroom and gear storage area for a reel.

August 1938 Byron Shire Council accepted a Tender from Mr. Harry Jaggers of Bangalow to erect a two storey fibro building at a cost of \$2048. It was officially opened on 17th December, 1938. This was a remarkable job as all materials, including gravel and cement - massive support timbers and fibro cement sheeting had to be transported across the footbridge on which a wooden rail line had been laid and continued through trees and sand dunes to the construction site. A horse was used to pull the loaded trolley. Funding for the project, \$1000 from N.S.W. Dept. of Public Works -\$600 from the Surf Club and \$448 from Byron Shire Council. Complaints were made that the clubhouse too far from the beach, with a lot of trees and sand dunes before one reached the surf.

1944 - 1945

Club engaged G. Tegge and C. Wraight to construct a two storey fibro extension on the southern side. Upper level as a bunkroom and lower as boatshed and gear room at a cost of \$560.

A caretakers two room residence was constructed, and was washed away in the ${\bf 1950}$ cyclone.

1951

Club gave Council \$700 to construct a log wall to stop sea erosion - after many futile efforts by Council to complete the project, they finally engaged Kennedy Bros to build this wall, which was completed in 1955, and is still in place under front concrete aprons of the present building in 1995. Kennedy Bros also built the new footbridge in 1994.

1957 - 1958

Surf Club accepted tenders from Uniting Builders (Bill and Ken Ball and John-Snow), to erect a fibro pitched roof to replace the original flat roof which continually leaked -plus an extension on the observation tower with a room for the surf club beach broadcasting equipment, total cost was \$2,215 of which Council donated \$400, and the club the remainder-voluntary workers then painted the clubhouse inside and out, with the Brunswick - Mullumbimby Lions Club Members providing most of the labour. Brunswick Heads Progress Association donated \$200 towards the paint.

1959

The traffic bridge to South beach was constructed and after the sand mining of the area in 1966-1967, a bitumen road and parking area was constructed. This ended an era of carrying gear and equipment to and from the clubhouse via the footbridge. Even surf boats were carried across, as well as poles to install electricity to the club house in the early 1940's. How things change! 1995 Lifesavers complain if the tractor is not working to carry patrol gear to the beach from the club house.

29 December 1964

A tornado hit the club house and caused severe damage -Council used insurance money to repair the building, but years of erosion, corrosion and white ants had taken their toll as the building had a more pronounced lean on its foundations.

1968

Mr. Laurie Neave - architect - and Shire Deputy Engineer, lan.Cook, drew up plans for a new brick club house and in July of that year Council called tenders for its construction on the same site. United Builders were the successful tenderers at a price of \$22,000, Council paid \$5,500 and the surf club \$16,500. The old building was demolished in August, new foundations poured in November, all gear back in building at Christmas, and officially opened January, 1969.

February 1972

A cyclone caused major erosion in front of the club house with waves washing over the lawn area and hitting the building - no sand was available on our beach and Batson Sand & Gravel transported loads of sand from their quarry at Byron Bay so as volunteers could fill sand bags to protect the area. A wall was erected in line with the present open air shower on the dune front. The battle was finally won and for

years club members erected brush fences at various angles -laid brush and planted spinifex runners to gradually reclaim the terrace - this was done a long time before brush fences became commonly used for anti erosion purposes.

February 1973


More space needed and club called tenders for an extension. United Builders (now Ball & Co), were again successful with a tender of \$6,700. Club paid \$6000 and Council \$700. These extensions included a brick storeroom erected by voluntary labour under leadership of Allan and Ted Riches. Extension officially opened May 1973.

1975 - 1976


Club commenced planning of extensions of upstairs portion of club house with possible finance to come from Federal Government R.E.D. Scheme, but unfortunately the application was not submitted in time and the idea was dropped. Again in the late 1980's the project was resurrected and May 1990 plans again submitted to Council. After many changes to plans and hold ups from many state government departments involved, the club was finally given permission to take over Public Dressing Rooms in the building for extra space for amenities for our female members and gear storage.

2nd December 1991

Written permission from Council to go ahead saw an extensive effort by tradesman and volunteers. Soon our female rembers had four showers, three toilets, a basin etc., and the club had an enlarged space for I.R.B. and board and ski storage.



Total cost for this stage was \$11,200 plus 205 hours of volunteer work all from the club. Frustration continued with delays from Council regarding extensions upstairs. Club asked Mr. Bill Ball to draw up plans which he did on a voluntary capacity and finally in June 1992 Council accepted a tender from Mr. Geoff Miller from Kingscliff for \$73,300. Unfortunately the tender papers issued by Council omitted many specifications and items, which had to be negotiated with the builder. The surf club also authorised extras such as seating on the balcony, brick seating downstairs, changes to all downstairs doors, security grills etc., two new hot water systems, floor coverings upstairs, tables and chairs, fitting out of the kitchen, office, new Casualty Room etc., all amounting to a final figure of \$108,000, totally met from club funds which included donations of \$5,000 from Brunswick Surf Life Saving Club Junior Section, \$7,500 from Byron Shire Council, \$1,000 from Brunswick - Mullumbimby Lions Club Members, \$10,000 from Ros Kelly, Federal Minister for Sports and Recreation, through efforts by Mr. Neville Newell M.P. and a N.S.W. Government Sports and Recreation Department Grant through Don Page M.P. of \$12,000. The building was officially opened by Shire Mayor Ian Kingston January 1993. My personal ambition was to raise enough funds and open the building free of debt. This was achieved thanks to Chincogan Fiesta fundraising, good interest on investments, and other fund raising events all combined to raise sufficient finance. As a result, the club has a new lock up kitchen complete with an urn; and a fridge donated by Robert Bridgland of Retravision Mullumbimby. A lock up furnished office, with carpeted floor, as a donation by Ray and Joan Towers Floor Covering Co of Mullumbimby. A bar constructed by Stan Ceglinski and Gavan Kiker - a large upstairs bar fridge donated by the Nippers, a nice big upstairs area suitable for social and fundraising events - training of members -and overnight accommodation and a nice balcony area. Ten tables and sixty chairs plus a downstairs catering and refreshment area built by Mark Edwards



- Errol Bartz and other helpers. Drink can dispensing unit - large food and drink fridge in this area plus a lockup store room and cooking facilities A fully equipped Casualty Room (even the stretcher trolley was sandblasted and recovered and new wheels fitted - note that this trolley was donated from the OLD Mullumbimby Hospital). The former Ladies Room was converted to the Nippers Board Storage Area, and a large I.R.B. Room takes all of our boards, boats and skis. With the nice big amenities area for our ladies the club has top facilities which should be sufficient for a few years, when perhaps a further extension on the upstairs could be made if needed. The contractor, Mr. Jeff Miller provided a plaque to record the official opening. Acknowledgement of support and donations to the club during the opening day are as follows:-pot plants and garden -Julie and Peter Baines and Bob Black. Apex help at the B.B.Q on opening day - Dave Kolb and his Dynaflows for musical

support. Bashforths truck for the band. Billie and Dick Arthur donation of binoculars and donation of tent sides in conjunction with Jackie and Russell Dennett of Foodtown, Mullumbimby. The Fish'N'Chips Committee donation of Patrol Shorts. Brunswick Valley Banana Growers for donation of Patrol Trailer for the club use. Bob Richardson for his sign writing. Jeff Miller started work on extensions on 5th August and finished 5th November 1992 with the building being officially opened on 2nd January, 1993.

GEAR OWNED BY THE CLUB


Further purchase and disposal of surf boats since our "50 Year Book".

<u>"BRUNSWICK IV"</u> was sold to Byron Bay Surf Club as a training boat - later returned to Brunswick and used, until it became unseaworthy, and sold cheap to a private buyer.

"BRUNSWICK V" was sold to Peter Christie February 1988 complete with old trailer, oars etc., for 2,200 -still in fair order at fifteen years old.

HOTEL BRUNSWICK - POW WOW

The Nippers purchased this boat from Woolgoolga Surf Club, and completely refurbished it. Hotel Brunswick Licensee, Laurie Driscoll, fully sponsored the hull - oars donated by Gareth and Scott Evans of Foodland Mullumbimby - and a sweep oar by Rod Colback of the New Brighton Store. This boat was later sold to Redcliffe Peninsula Surf Club in 1992 for \$1,000. August 1992 members declared an interest in surf boat rowing and as a result a surf boat fitted with oars, rowlocks and pumps was purchased from Kirra Surf Club. This boat was stripped, refurbished and named "Golden Shores", donated by Ray White and Company Real Estate Brunswick Heads who presented the club with a cheque for \$1,500 to cover all costs (estimated value of this boat is \$5,000 on present day prices, a good deal).

A new galvanised boat trailer was purchased with funds from sale "POW WOW" so the club is nicely set up in its surf boat dept. All that is needed now are dedicated members to train long, hard hours both in river and surf before they can expect major wins in competition.

As a point of interest "GOLDEN SHORES" is fitted with electric drainage pumps, and an electric pump to spray soapy water on rowers seats to prevent chafing, and wear and tear on their bottoms. A change from years gone by when rowers wore their girlfriends briefs under speedo trunks for racing - suppose it was a good opportunity to get into their girlfriends pants! Gone are the days of full length speedos -cork life jackets, a bucket to bail out water, then the luxury of a rotary hand pump turned by either the sweep or stroke oarsmen - blow up rollers to move the heavy boats up and down the beach - what changes!

INFLATABLE RESCUE BOATS

Or I.R.B., more commonly known as rubber duckies were introduced to Australia in early 1970's and to the Far North Coast Branch in 1975. Fingal purchased the first and Brunswick the second. Warren Mitchell who introduced the "Ducks" to Australia, after having experience with them when employed as a permanent lifeguard in England. He joined the Brunswick Club and soon his enthusiasm spread amongst club members. Thanks to his enthusiasm and coaching, Brunswick had the top 1.R.B. crews in Australia, holding many Branch, Zone, State and National Titles.

1987-88 a new Achillies hull with a special floor was purchased for \$5,200.

1989-90 another new hull was purchased at a cost of \$7,900 from Achillies (the older hull was traded in for \$3,500).

<u>September 1992</u> another Achillies 375 hull purchased from Ken Brown Marine for \$5,900, no trade.

October 1994 a new Achillies hull purchased for \$6,280, model 375.

NEW OUTBOARD MOTORS

New outboards purchased by club since the "50 Year Book" list. A policy of trading in motors every twelve months has proved to be successful, and the thanks of the club go to Gryff and Kay Ethell of Lismore Outboard Sales and Service who supply and service our Mercury outboards.

<u>September 1986</u> 2 Johnson motors traded in on 2 Mercuries at cost of \$200.

<u>July 1987</u> Mallams of Mullumbimby donated 1 Mercury motor with two fuel tanks to the club valued at \$1,370.

June 1988 2 Mercs traded in on 2 new ones, cost \$1,000.

October 1989 2 Mercs traded in on 2 new ones, cost \$500.

June 1990 2 Mercs traded in on 2 new ones, cost \$500.

Gryff and Kay also donated a fully reconditioned motor for patrol use only and pledged continued support for the club by providing free labour for services

June 1991 2 Mercs traded in on 2 new ones, cost \$1,400.

September 1994 2 Mercs traded in on 2 new ones, cost \$1,600.

1995 a new Management Plan on I.R.B.'s has been adopted, motors to be traded every twelve months - hulls to be traded every three years, this should save the club a lot in maintenance club every year





In 1967 - 68? Ken Schaefer who had been involved in the Junior Surf Life Saving Movement in Sydney in the early 1960's was instrumental in the setting up of the first Nippers at Brunswick Heads. With a determined group of supporters namely Jim and Carmel Budd, Alec and Lola Fenwick, Marj Storer etc.... Nippers started. A donation was received from the Brunswick Heads Progress Association and a March Past flag and reel were purchased. Marj Storer made caps and costumes?

Unfortunately after only one season because of lack of help and other circumstances they folded and the reel etc. was put into storage.

In 1981, (over a quiet beer at the pub) John McKay and Dave Evans discussed the possibility of reforming the Nippers at Brunswick Heads. On the 27th August, 1981 a meeting was held for interested parents to discuss this possibility. Chris Johnston from the Senior Club vowed the support of the seniors and a steering committee was formed to find out the necessary details involved in the forming of the Junior Club. The steering committee of Ray Knight, Roger Docking, Dave Evans, Colin Loomes, Peter Holdsworth and John McKay agreed to meet with Jim Clark from the Byron Bay Nippers Club and reported back to a formation meeting on the 17th September, 1981.



On that day the first official Nippers Committee was formed with John McKay elected President, Dave Evans as Secretary and Peter Holdsworth Treasurer. Byron Bay Junior Surf Life Saving Club paid the first years affiliation fees on Brunswick's behalf. It was agreed that signon fees of 50c would be charged (20c for registration and 30c toward equipment). Two boards would be purchased with monies donated, 1 fibreglass board and 1 hollow board, and so was the beginning of the Brunswick Junior Life Saving Club.

During the following months 3 more boards were purchased and several local businesses and clubs donated money towards the cost of the new equipment. Weekly raffles and bar-b-ques were organised as fund-raising and in February Mr. Harry Baines was elected the first patron of the Junior Club, a position which he still proudly holds.

1982 saw extensive campaigning for funds from local clubs and services for the purchase of equipment and boards. Fortunately for the Nippers the community supported them financially (and still does) and several competition and training boards were able to be purchased.





In March 1982 the Nippers approached the Council and Lands Department with the view of building its own club house on a site ajoining the Seniors Club House. Funding from Council was not available but other avenues were pursued. The approximate cost of the building was \$35,000

After several months and discussion with the Seniors it was decided not to go ahead with the building until the Seniors decided what extensions would be done to the existing Clubhouse.

Each following year there was a fluctuation in the number of children who signed on with Nippers. In 1982 there were 96, but in 1982 / 1983 only 89. 1986 numbers again dropped to 70 and in 1987 / 88 only 49 children were registered.

Even with fewer numbers there were still some outstanding results at local carnivals and Branch and Country Championships. Gold medals were won by L. Evans, S. Jordon, M. Docking and Y. West 1986 saw Country Medals go to P. Thomas (gold 10 yrs. surf swim), B. Fuller (gold 9 yrs. flags), 7 yr wade relay team of S. Fuller, J. Haines, J. Dixon and C. Jarvis (gold). This amazing group of four 7 year old boys also won silver at the State Carnival and gold at the Branch Carnival the same year for the same event.

During the 1987 / 88 season with just 49 children registered the Junior Club was officially amalgamated with the Senior Club. The Juniors also purchased their tent which still offers shelter at our beach and carnivals today. The purchase of the tent was due largely to the efforts of Sandra Fuller who spent many long hours pursuing prices and sponsors. A raffle time slot was also secured at the Chincogan Tavern by Stewart Stevens to help raise funds. These raffles are still run on Friday evenings and are the major source of income for the Nippers. After Nippers bar-b-ques were started around 1988 as a chance for parents to get together and also as a means to make a little extra money.


John Fuller was instrumental in organising older lifesavers and Nippers parents during 1988/89 season to help on patrols so that senior members (only 27), had an opportunity to attend Senior Carnivals without leaving Brunswick unprotected. There has always been a great integration from Nippers to the Senior ranks. In 1992 out of 55 active members 32 had come directly or indirectly from Nippers ranks.

At the Branch Carnival held at Brunswick in 1992 Amanda Robinson won the "Eddie Buchanan" award for being the 7 year old competitor who had scored the most points at carnivals during the season - a great achievement.


To date there are still five original Nippers members from 1981 / 82 who are actively involved with the Brunswick Surf Club - Gavin, Andrew and Shane Arthur, Justin Prisk and Leigh Evans. Many of the current members of the Seniors were Nippers and a great many ex-nippers are still involved within the community.

Two Brunswick Nippers went out to win Branch nominations and represent Far North Coast Branch at the State Carnival for "Nipper of the Year" - Ben Fuller in 1991 and Sam Fuller in 1993.


It would be remiss not to mention two outstanding ex-nippers being Petria Thomas and Sam Fuller.





Petria joined Nippers as a ten year old in the 1985 / 86 season. She continued until as a 13 year old completed her Surf Life Saving Certificate and then onto the seniors to complete her Bronze Medallion. During her time in the Nippers she held various Club, Branch and Country Titles and won numerous medals (all while still pursuing her still water swimming). As a U/18 year old she was awarded the title of Carnival person at the Country Championships at Kingscliffe, the first female competitor in N.S.W. to ever win this award. Petria's achievements have been outstanding in the pool as well and as we all know won two gold medals at the 1994 Commonwealth Games in Canada. Each trip home to Mullumbimby she always finds the time to enjoy a surf and even a patrol or two at Brunswick.





Sam Fuller joined Nippers as a 7 year old in 1986 / 87 and immediately let his presence be felt as a tough competitor. He won gold medals at Country and Branch and a team silver medal at State. He went on to win N.S.W. Country Championship (surf, swim, 8 and 9 years) an (board 8 and 10 years) and was placed second and two thirds at State. Sam has won thirteen individual Branch Championships in swim, board, ironman and flags as well as Senior and junior surf teams, board rescue, cameron and board relay titles. Sam was rewarded in 1992 when as a 12 year old he was selected in the N.S.W. team tom compete at the National Titles at Anglesen Victoria. (the first Brunswick competitor to be chosen). Sam is now an active member of the Senior Movement and can often be seen surfing in the big seas notorious to Brunswick - and loving every minute of it.

The Club has gone from strength to strength and now boasts over 100 junior members. Every year the children do us proud by performing well at home and at carnivals. There have been so many outstanding performances by Brunswick Nippers over the years with many children winning Branch, Country and State medals. So many Nippers have moved from the junior movement to the seniors which is the main purpose of Nippers - to lay a foundation for future lifesavers.






